Basic Bottom up Triangular Shawl #2

This basic, bottom up, triangular shawl is started with a single stitch and features symmetric yarn overs inside a 5 st edging. The entire shawl is worked in basic garter stitch, using a large needle with a fingering weight yarn to achieve a more lacy appearance. The top edge is finished with an i-cord edge to soften the line across the neck.

Sizes: varies depending on yarn size and quantity

MATERIALS

Yarn: Fingering weight yarn, at least 600 yards
(Shawl shown knitted in Blue Moon Fiber Arts Silkie Socks That Rock, 360yds/3.5 oz, 2 skeins colorway Cockcrow)

Needles: 32 in. circular needle, Size US 8 (5mm)
Doubled pointed needle (dpn), Size US 10 (6mm)

Gauge: Varies depending on yarn choice and size of needles.

Abbreviations:

- CO** Cast-on
BO Bind-off
St, Sts Stitch, Stitches
K Knit
Kfb Knit into the front and back of the same stitch
Kfbf Knit into the front, back, and front again of the same stitch.
YO Yarn over
K2tog Knit 2 sts together
Cable CO *Insert right needle between first and second sts on left needle. Wrap yarn and draw through as if to knit, but do not release any sts from left needle. Slip new stitch from right needle to left. Repeat from * to designed number of CO sts.
PM Place marker
SM Slip marker

Pattern:

Using circular needle, CO 1 st.
Row 1: Kfb (2 sts)
Row 2 (and all even rows): K
Row 3: K1, Kfb, K1 (4 sts)



Row 5: K1, Kfb, Kfb, K1 (6 sts)

Repeat rows 5 and 6 until 2 times more (10 sts), ending with and even numbered row.

Next row 1: K5, YO, K5 (11 sts)

Row 2: K5, PM, K1, PM, K5

Row 3: K5, SM, YO, K to marker, YO, SM, K5 (13 sts)

Row 4 (and all remaining even rows): K

Repeat rows 3 and 4 until shawl is desired width when lightly stretched.

Begin I-cord edging as follows:

Cable CO 2 sts.

*Using DPN, K2, K2tog. Slip all 3 sts from right needle to left, repeat from * until all stitches of top edge have been used. 3 sts will remain on right needle. Slip all 3 sts back to left needle and BO loosely.

Secure ends and block aggressively.

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
